### **LASIK Surgery Discounts Available to Montefiore Associates**

If you or an immediate family member (spouse or children) has been planning to or are considering whether to undergo LASIK surgery, it may make sense from a quality, safety and cost standpoint to receive this service from Montefiore's Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences at its new office at Montefiore Medical Specialists of Westchester, located at 495 Central Park Avenue, in Scarsdale.

This practice offers laser refractive surgery, also known as LASIK surgery, using the WaveLight FS200 Femtosecond Laser for improved safety and efficacy. This laser is one of the first of its kind in the nation and the first installed in the Northeast.

In conjunction with opening this new facility, the Department of Ophthalmology and Vision Sciences has established a LASIK surgery discount of 20 percent off of the regular charge for Montefiore associates and their immediate family members.

Charges in connection with LASIK surgery are also reimbursable expenses under Health Care Flexible Spending Accounts, like the one available to Montefiore associates who are eligible to enroll under Montefiore's self-insured health plans. Health Care Flexible Spending Accounts are funded by associates through payroll deduction with pre-tax dollars. The combination of the discount that is being offered and the tax savings associated with paying for the surgery through a flexible spending account help make this surgery more affordable.

### **Lubin Rehabilitation Center: Advancing Function While Enriching Lives**

An ATV accident left 21-year-old Jose from Guatemala with a fractured spine and an injured spinal cord. When he arrived at Montefiore his mobility was severely compromised. Transferring from the bed to chair was difficult and walking looked like a remote possibility. At the Lubin Rehabilitation Center, part of the Department of Rehabilitation Medicine, Jose began regaining his strength assisted by an interdisciplinary team. Securely harnessed in the "navigaitor"—a unique partial body weight suspension system that allows patients to practice moving in any direction without the risk of falling, Jose took his first steps early in his recovery.

"This treatment approach jump-started his recovery," said Maya Therattil, MD, Director of Spinal Cord Injury Medicine and Inpatient Rehabilitation Services at Montefiore. "It's such a psychological boost to be able to start learning how to walk early in the rehabilitation process. Normally patients accomplish this two-to-three months after their injuries." Jose left the Center after

a week and a half. Dr. Therattil said that Montefiore made an impression on Jose's family, and they noted the compassionate care he received.

Patients are admitted to the Lubin Rehabilitation Center, a 20-bed inpatient facility located at the Weiler Division, when they require acute rehabilitation due to an illness or injury—for example, a stroke, hip fracture, spinal cord injury, or joint replacements. An interdisciplinary team of physiatrists, rehabilitation nurses, physical therapists, occupational therapists, speech language pathologists and social workers work together in conjunction with the referring teams to help patients regain the skills they need to function in their daily activities. "Our patients receive three hours of therapy each day, and incorporate the functional skills they learn at therapy while they are back in their rooms" said Dr.Therattil.

At the Center, the use of cutting edge technology helps the patients recover; Flexible Endoscopic Evaluation of Swallowing with Sensory Testing is used to diagnose swallowing disorders in patients who have had a stroke, Parkinson's disease or multiple sclerosis. A flexible scope with a tiny camera is placed through the patient's nose and into their
