Norman B. Medow, MD, is a board certified ophthalmologist with more than 35 years of experience in treating eye disorders in children. His clinical and research interests include the treatment of cataracts, glaucoma, and corneal diseases. As Director of Pediatric Ophthalmology and Adult Strabismus, Dr. Medow will focus on translating Montefiore's expertise and resources in eye care and research of eye diseases to the pediatric population.

"I was drawn to Montefiore because of the opportunity to help the pediatric ophthalmology division grow," says Dr. Medow. "We're focusing on opening new offices, particularly in areas that are currently underserved in pediatric ophthalmology, like the East Bronx. In addition, we launched a new fellowship in pediatric ophthalmology in July. We are also developing expertise in subspecialty areas—such as pediatric neuro-ophthalmology, congenital eye diseases and strabismus—so very difficult cases can be sent here."

"Dr. Medow's expertise in pediatric eye disorders further strengthens our clinical and research endeavors at Montefiore," says Roy S. Chuck, MD, PhD, Chair of the Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Sciences at Montefiore. "He joins a very high-caliber team that is dedicated to advancing the field of ophthalmology, increasing access to premier eye care services and elevating the current standards of treatment through research."

Dr. Medow received his medical degree from SUNY Downstate College of Medicine in Brooklyn and completed both his residency in ophthalmology and his fellowship in cataract surgery at Manhattan Eye, Ear & Throat Institute. He joins Montefiore after serving as Director of Pediatric Ophthalmology at Manhattan Eye, Ear & Throat Institute, a Clinical Professor of

Ophthalmology at Weill Cornell Medical College, and an Attending Ophthalmologist at New York-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center.

For 25 years, Dr. Medow was a preceptor for the pediatric ophthalmology fellowship program at Manhattan Eye, Ear & Throat Institute. At Montefiore, he will be involved in training the pediatric ophthalmology fellows and the ophthalmology residents.

An author of more than 100 journal articles and book chapters, Dr. Medow serves on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Pediatric Ophthalmology & Strabismus* and *Ophthalmology Times*. He lectures all over the world on the history of ophthalmology and is the chair of the Museum of Vision of the Foundation of the American Academy of Ophthalmology. He is also a member of the medical advisory board for the Eye-Bank for Sight Restoration. Prior to becoming an ophthalmologist, Dr. Medow served in the United States Navy Medical Corps and achieved the rank of Lieutenant Commander.
